

## **Section 5: Fort Myer**

### ***Fort Myer Security***

**Will the proposed height of Building #2 effect security on Fort Myer?** No. Force Protection representatives of Fort Myer confirmed that the proposed buildings do not pose a security threat.

### ***Access for Soldiers***

**How will the project tie into Fort Myer?** We have met three times with the Commanding Officer of Fort Myer and one additional time with command representatives to discuss access for soldiers, retail demand, and their Rental Partnership Program. Soldiers today have limited access through Henry gate to the current Duron and Lee Centers. The gate is generally closed in the evening hours and there is only limited service on the weekends. However, Fort Myer representatives view the proposed redevelopment as a significant benefit for workers at the base if access could be improved and are planning to install an automated pedestrian gate that reads military ID cards. This will allow soldiers 24-hour foot access to the site, which will provide a better connection between Lyon Park and Fort Myer and provide better access to the retail for employees on the base, who represent an important market segment for potential retail tenants.
